Animals eat different kind of food

1. **Herbivores:** Animals eat only plants are called plant-eating animals or herbivores. Eg cows, goat, buffalo etc.
2. **Carnivores:** Animals eat flesh of other animals are called flesh-eating animals or carnivores. Eg lions, leopards, tigers etc.
3. **Omnivores:** Animals eat plants and flesh of other animals are called omnivores eg bears, dogs, crows etc.
